Dear Mr. Judge:

The Boston Harbor Association is a non-profit, public interest organization founded in 1973 by the League of Women Voters and the Boston Shipping Association to promote a clean, alive, and accessible Boston Harbor.

We attended the 27 February 2008 Public Meeting in South Boston regarding the Public Involvement Plan (PIP) for Release Tracking Number 3-4519, Tank No. 3 Release Site located at Exelon New Boston's Station at 776 Summer Street, South Boston.

Please consider The Boston Harbor Association an interested party in this site, and please provide us with notice and notes of all future meetings as well as other communications concerning the PIP and the New Boston station.

As discussed at the meeting, Exelon Power has retained a real estate advisor to examine potential future uses of the site which is part of the South

Boston Designated Port Area. While that analysis is not yet completed, The Boston Harbor Association strongly urges that all future uses be consistent with uses allowed in the Designated Port Area.

Regarding the Public Involvement Plan, a fuller public process might be realized with a neutral party, such as the Department of Environmental Protection or MassDevelopment's Brownfields staff, available to explain the deactivation and on-going monitoring processes, and to answer community questions about the site. We also suggest that all comment letters be included in the submission to DEP, together with Exelon's responses.

Regarding the required on-going monitoring at the site following the Tank 3 releases, we are particularly concerned about water quality impacts, including impacts to the Reserved Channel, and look forward to additional information on water quality effects from the releases.

Thank you in advance for your consideration of the above. We look forward to further discussion of the above at the public meetings on 24 March and 28 April 2008 and beyond.
